One Stop Talk/Parlons Maintenant is a virtual platform that lets clients call or connect from **anywhere** in Ontario and get brief mental health services in a single session.

Who can use it?

Waitlist, active, **new** or potential clients of participating sites as well as those of select partners in pilot site communities. As the program evolves, more individuals will have access to the service and eventually *One Stop Talk/Parlons Maintenant* will be available to all children and youth in Ontario and their families.
